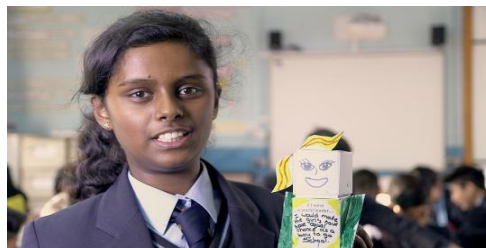
KS1 – If I were a world leader...



What would you do if you were a world leader?

A lot of good things have happened since 2000:

- 50 million more children go to school than fifteen years ago.
- There are more girls in school.
- There are more children living with disability in school.



- Five million school children in the UK have taken part in Send My Friend to School. They want ALL children to go to school.

What needs to change?

- More children need to go to school. 58 million children do not go to primary school.
- There are still 31 million girls who have never been to primary school.
- 1 in 3 children missing out on school have a disability.
- Nearly half of children out of school live with conflict.
- More money is needed. It costs \$26 billion every year to send all children to school.
