Memory's story



Memory is 10 years old and goes to Nazombe Primary School in Palombe, Malawai.

Memory lives with her father (who is a welder), mother (who is a teacher at her school) and her 12-year old sister. To get to school Memory walks for an hour with her mother and sister.

When she is older, Memory wants to be either a doctor or to run her own business selling clothes. Describing her school, Memory said:

"In our school we have 4500 children and in each class we have 75 – 100 children – we sit tightly together in class."

Memory told us:

"It's not fair (that some children don't go to school), they are not learning things we are learning. They tell me – if they see us going to school they feel pain in their hearts..."
