


APPLY TO BE A CAMPAIGN CHAMPION (2024 - 25)

PROGRAMME TIMELINE

Jan 2024

INTERVIEWS

Send My Friend to School will hold interviews with shortlisted students and their teacher.

April - June 2024

COMMUNITY ACTION

The period in which Campaign Champions create their own campaign activities in their school or wider communities.

Sep - Oct 2024

PARTY CONFERENCES

Campaign Champions may have the opportunity to attend Lib Dem, Labour & Conservative Party conference to amplify the campaign further.

March 2024

TRAINING

In early March campaign champions will attend a 3 day residential to meet one another and learn more about the campaign*.

June 2024

DAY IN PARLIAMENT

This is the key event of the campaign journey where young people will take to Parliament and share their campaign activities and asks with MPs and Parliamentarians. You can expect to meet with around 20 MPs!

APPLICATION INFO

The Send My Friend to School campaign values diversity, equality and inclusion for persons working for and on behalf of the campaign. We strongly encourage applications from young people of any gender, disabled young people and young people of diverse cultural, ethnic, socio-economic and other distinctive backgrounds. If you need any additional support to complete the application form then please do get in touch. Where possible, we hope to get a gender balance of applicants.

For Teachers:

- To apply, schools need to submit one application, for two students and one teacher. Please note that all national activities are funded by Send My Friend to School.
- The campaign itself is incredibly easy to run in schools, (e.g. as part of tutor time, in geography, PHSE, citizenship, English or as an enrichment activity)
- The teacher will be the point of contact between Send my Friend to School, and the school's chosen Campaign Champions
- Teacher will need to accompany students to any in-person events, meetings with other young campaigners and other additional opportunities that may arise
